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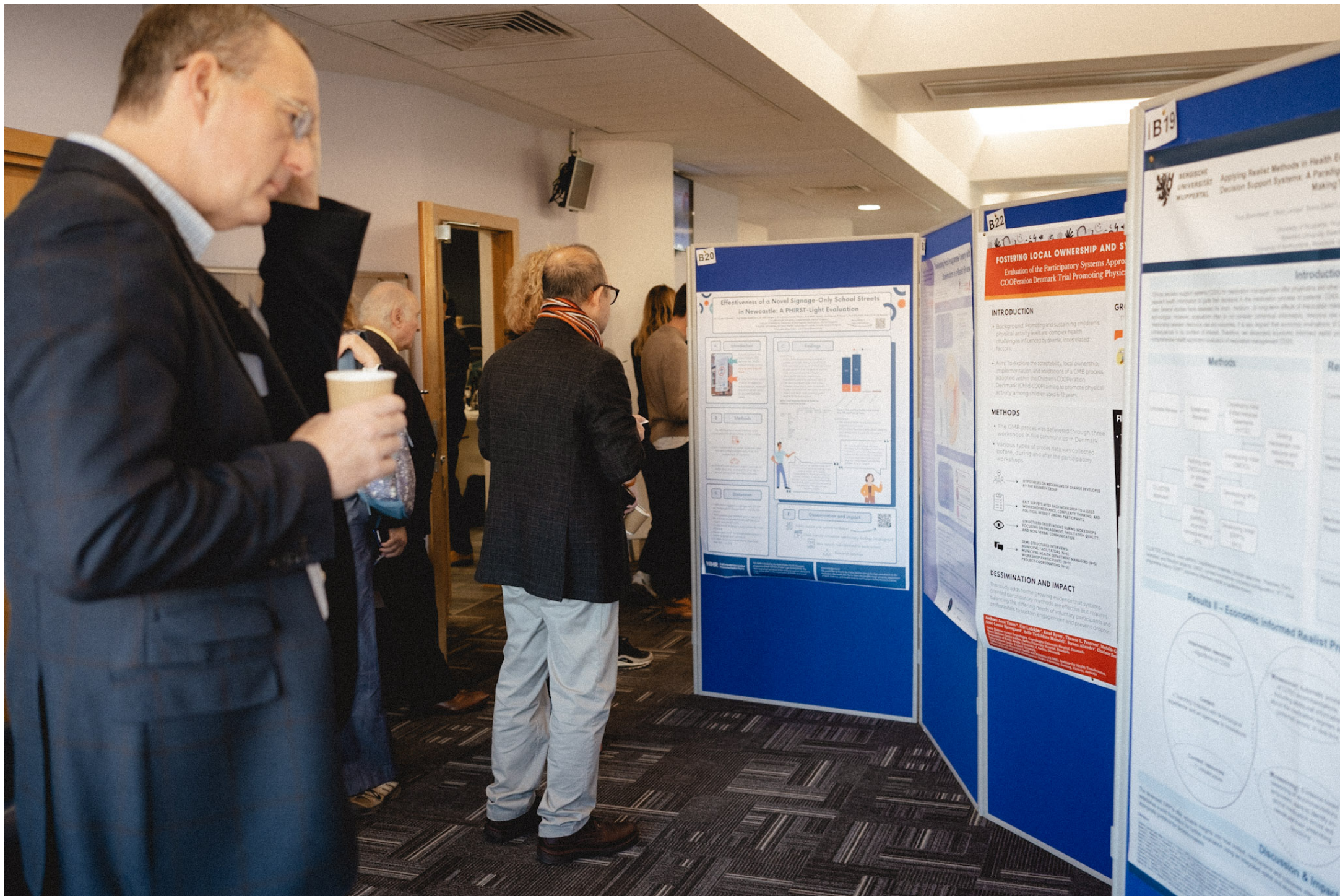

### FOSTERING LOCAL OWNERSHIP AND SUSTAINABILITY OF THE PARTICIPATORY SYSTEMS APPROACH: EVALUATION OF THE PARTICIPATORY SYSTEMS APPROACH (PSA) IN THE PHIRST-LIGHT EVALUATION

**INTRODUCTION**

- Background: Promoting and sustaining children's physical activity requires complex health challenges influenced by diverse, interrelated factors.
- Aims: To explore the acceptability, local ownership, implementation, and adaptation of a CMB process adapted within the Children's COOPERATION Denmark (CHILD-COOP) aiming to promote physical activity among children aged 6-12 years.

**METHODS**

- The CMB process was delivered through three workshops in five communities in Denmark.
- Various types of proxy data was collected: online, during and after the participatory workshops.

**DISSEMINATION AND IMPACT**

The study adds to the growing evidence that systems-based participatory methods are effective but requires tailoring the offering needs of voluntary participants and professionals to sustain engagement and prevent dropout.

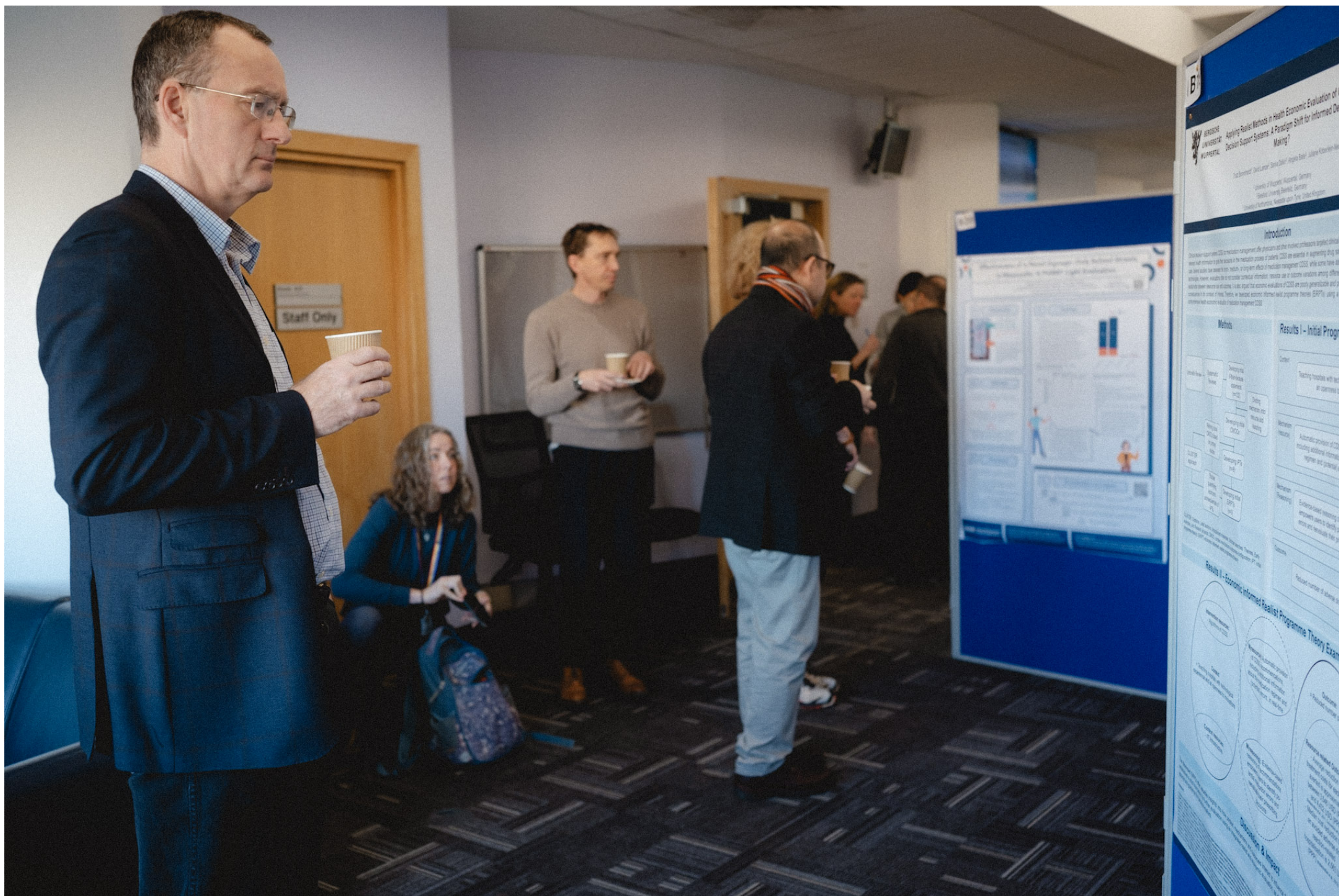

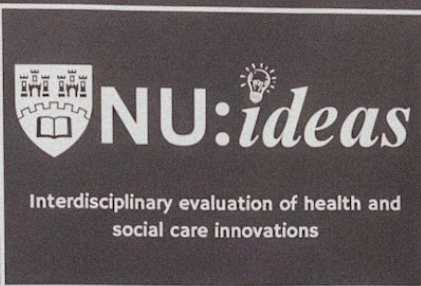












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
